Preliminary Review and Strategic Positioning

Typically, we begin by reviewing your transcript (courses and grades), standardized test scores, extracurricular activities, talents, and courses that you are currently taking, as well as the courses that you plan to take in the following year(s). In addition, we discuss admissions positioning strategies, focusing on what you can do both inside and outside the classroom to ensure maximum consideration of your credentials.

Developing the College List and Assessing Your Admission Prospects

Based on our preliminary review, we compile a list of colleges and academic programs that represent the best match between your interests/credentials and the institution's admissions standards and offerings. We also provide an assessment of your admissions chances at each of your prospective colleges.

College Visits

At the height of the COVID pandemic, most colleges invested heavily in producing high-quality virtual tours and other online resources for prospective applicants. Yet, when feasible, it can still be immensely beneficial to make a physical trip to a handful of campuses. We advise clients on how to make the most of these exciting and informative trips.

Demonstrating Interest

An underappreciated aspect of the admissions process, students receive guidance on how and when to most effectively "demonstrate interest" in their prospective colleges. How likely colleges believe an applicant is to enroll plays a more significant role in admissions decisions than most realize. We'll ensure that you are on the right path in this regard.

Completing Applications

Once we have devised a list of suitable "target" colleges, we will assist you in coordinating application materials and completing all applications. We clarify application instructions, review forms, and provide guidance on all questions/items. After drafts are completed, we review each application for omissions, unanswered questions, inconsistencies and any other "red flags" that may negatively impact your admission prospects.

Essays/Personal Statements

Initially, we work with you to brainstorm essay topics that are capable of reflecting your best attributes. We then assist you in developing essay content, while teaching you the elements of an effective college essay. Finally, we review your essays for clarity of expression and grammatical correctness, and offer further suggestions on how you can enhance your writing. It's important to note that we will spend as much time as needed to help you draft authentic and compelling essays that represent the best of what you have to offer to your prospective colleges.

Activities List/Resume and Extracurricular Planning

The activities list has become an increasingly important part of the college application. We will help you devise an activity sheet/resume that is clear, concise, and reflective of your involvement both inside and outside the classroom. In addition, we will help you identify and deepen your involvement in the extracurricular activities that will distinguish you from similarly accomplished applicants and enable you to further explore/develop your interests.





Course Planning

The strength of your curriculum (i.e. the difficulty level of your courses) is often times viewed as equally or more important in the admissions process than your grade point average or standardized test scores. Each year, we advise you on which courses you should choose in order to maximize your admission prospects without compromising your class rank/GPA and ability to engage in extracurricular pursuits.

The College Interview

The college interview can prove as an important factor in the college admissions process, and can even prove as the key to admission for a borderline applicant. As such, we provide extensive coaching on the college interview. We teach you how to prepare, what questions to expect, and what questions to ask. In addition, we review interview etiquette and teach you how to leave a positive impression with your interviewer. Finally, through our mock interview sessions, we help you to achieve a high level of comfort and confidence on interview day.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Scholarships and other financial aid for college are not limited to students with financial need. Regardless of your financial circumstances, we provide sound advice on how to secure competitive and non-competitive funds from your target colleges. Financial aid guidance includes advice on how to complete and process financial aid forms, how to apply for college scholarships, and what strategies you can employ to win merit (non-need-based) aid.

Decision Guidance

After receiving your admission offers, we schedule a meeting (and subsequent meetings, if necessary) exclusively devoted to reviewing the costs and benefits of attending each institution into which you have been admitted. Discussion and guidance focus on the evaluation of financial aid awards, the academic and extracurricular offerings of your prospective colleges, possible majors, and plans beyond your undergraduate study.

Standardized Testing Strategy

Whether you are a high school freshman, high school senior or potential college transfer, we will advise you on which standardized tests to take or re-take in order to maximize your admissions prospects and minimize time to major-related coursework and your college degree. Testing strategies encompass SAT, ACT, AP, IB, CLEP, and various subject tests, among others.

Transition Support

In the months before enrolling at your new institution, we help you explore majors, develop a program of study, and identify campus-based supports so that you have the knowledge and tools needed to succeed at your college of choice. In contrast to most college planners, we will work with you after acceptance because we believe that our success is measured not only on the basis of admission offers, but also on the basis of your college success and ability to maximize the benefits of a higher education.

Why a Private Counselor?

Aside from purchasing a home, a college education represents the largest investment you will make during your life. If you take into account the personal and professional benefits associated with earning a degree, college will likely be your most important investment.

Despite committing as much as \$350,000 toward college-related costs, students and their families rarely seek the advice of a specialist, as they would when purchasing a home or planning their retirement, for example. Instead, most families choose to rely on their respective high schools. Unfortunately, most schools have devoted less, not more, resources to college planning in recent years. School counselors, for example, play an extremely crucial role in promoting the personal and social development of our youth, but mounting responsibilities in the areas of academic remediation, mental health support, course scheduling, and state standardized testing have forced many school counselors to shift their focus away from college-related tasks. Currently, the average school counselor spends less than 40 minutes per student on college planning activities over the span of four years. In contrast, private college counselors focus exclusively on college guidance and can provide families with the personalized and intensive support they require. Ideally, private college counselors fill the need for greater college guidance by offering services that a typical school counselor cannot:

Private college counselors can also help families save on college costs, for example, by:

- Pointing students to good-fit colleges that are relatively inexpensive and where they are likely to receive significant (need-based and/or merit-based) financial aid.
- Teaching students how to maximize their financial aid eligibility and locate suitable scholarship opportunities.
- Pointing students to credit-earning opportunities before college admission, and helping them to navigate course (i.e. major and general education) requirements after admission both shorten a student's time to degree.
- Facilitating career exploration and recommending college majors that ultimately pave the way for professional fit and success.

Ultimately, (capable and well-trained) private counselors help students enroll and succeed at good-fit colleges, while ensuring that families receive a substantial return on their postsecondary investment.

Why College Transitions?

Our background...

Unlike most other providers, College Transitions counselors have worked on "both sides of the gate" – as high school counselors and administrators, and as college admission representatives. We are also published researchers, having authored articles on the college-related effects of counseling, the predictors of selective college admission, and education debt, among other topics. Our approach...

At College Transitions, we believe that the college admissions process should be about more than admission. We value personal growth and self-discovery as much as selectivity, and by doing so, we hope to bring perspective (and some sanity) to college planning.

Our fundamental objective is to guide students into good-fit colleges, where they can thrive and effectively pursue their personal and professional goals. We work toward this objective by leveraging our knowledge, as well as the knowledge of other professionals throughout higher education, with whom we have built extensive relationships over the course of our careers as researchers, admission counselors, and consultants.

What are the advantages of a remote arrangement?

We adopted a remote model in order to reach a broader range of families and better accommodate our students, many of whom have extremely busy schedules during the week, and as such, need to meet on short notice and/or during nights and weekends. We communicate through email, phone, and most often video chat (Zoom, Google Meet), responding to our families' needs more quickly and offering greater flexibility and availability than what could be offered in a traditional "brick and mortar" model. In the past ten years, we have provided remote services to students residing in nearly every state and more than a dozen countries. Ultimately, our long-term success has been due to our responsiveness and unique knowledge set, rather than our location or proximity to certain students.

Why are your prices so low?

Families researching the pricing and plans of multiple companies will soon find that our rates are equal to or lower than nearly every comparable provider. We keep rates relatively low because we can and because we want to. Initially, as school-based counselors and higher education researchers, we sought work more practical and lucrative than that available in an academic setting, but that still enabled us to do what we loved: helping a diverse group of students enroll and succeed in higher education. Over the past decade, we have been able to develop an online presence and remote-based model that allows us to deliver services in an effective and efficient manner, while serving an increasingly broad array of families. Ultimately, we have been fortunate enough to build a business that contributes to more than one bottom line.

Why are your prices so high?

Our rates are about average for our industry; however, we are sensitive to the reality that not all families can afford to pursue private college counseling. Therefore, in order to make our knowledge and expertise available to a broad range of students, we engage in a large number of pro-bono activities; operate a very extensive award-winning blog; publish books and blogs; and devote a substantial amount of time to building our Dataverse, which offers comprehensive information and data on hundreds of colleges and their admissions and financial aid policies. For those who can afford services, but are still undecided about whether college counseling is a wise investment, we encourage you to consider the many ways in which we ultimately save our families money (see previous page).

When Should I Start?

The bulk of our work together will occur in grades 11 and 12. However, 9th and 10th grade students can benefit from early planning—in the areas of high school academic advising, extracurricular planning, and major/career exploration, for instance.

We encourage prospective college transfers to contact us at least six months before their applications are due, but we can and do take on students throughout the transfer admission cycle.





When are you available?

College Transitions counselors are available weekdays, weeknights, and weekends. We work according to your schedule, and are fully committed to providing you with responsive and convenient support.

How Do You Deliver Services?

We work with families on a remote basis, delivering services through email, phone, and, most often, video chat using Zoom, Google Meet, or any other video chat platform that proves most convenient for the student and their parent(s). In our experience, any college-related task that can be accomplished in person can also be accomplished remotely—more efficiently and effectively in many cases.

Will others know I worked with a private counselor?

No. Maintaining your privacy and safeguarding your confidentiality is of the utmost importance to us. We do not release any identifying information about our families unless our families explicitly instruct us to do so.

Do you only work with elite students?

No. We work with students of all abilities and academic backgrounds. At College Transitions, we believe that we should be evaluated on our ability to guide all students to – and through – "good-fit" colleges, and not on our ability to get a few select students into a few select institutions. Do we take pride in guiding past clients into every Ivy League institution as well as other elite colleges? Absolutely. However, we take equal pride in guiding others to a wide range of excellent yet less competitive public universities and private institutions.

How do you define your success?

The short, quantifiable answer is that, in a typical year, 94-97% of our clients are admitted into one of their top-3 choice institutions. Further, our school-specific acceptance rates are generally between 4 and 8 times higher than the overall acceptance rate for the general population.

However, it is important to note that statistics of this nature from our company (or any other college counseling provider) have **significant limitations**. A portion of our success is, of course, due to the immensely talented group of students with which we have the privilege of assisting. Additional factors like the financial ability to apply via Early Decision can also be highly impactful.

Personally, the College Transitions team defines its success more holistically. 




